A Place to Call Home

Since LutherCare Communities opened its first group home in 1995, it has provided “a place to call home” for dozens of young men and women with physical or intellectual challenges. Today, LutherCare operates six group homes in Saskatoon, located at:

- 619 1st Street East
- 1506 9th Avenue North
- 1906 Alexandra Avenue
- 1914 Alexandra Avenue
- 1910 Alexandra Avenue
- 1929 Pembina Avenue

Residents pay no fees.

The spaces are funded and licensed by the Community Living Division of the Saskatchewan Ministry of Social Services. Applications for residency may be made through either LutherCare Communities or the Community Living Division. An admission and discharge committee reviews all applications to ensure compatibility among residents.



Program Features

The supportive services provided at LutherCare's group homes include the following:

- Medical needs
- Prescription administration
- Meal preparation
- Recreation
- Personal care
- School to life transition planning
- Vocational support
- Home maintenance
- Laundry services
- General household duties
- Transportation



A Normal Life Transition

When young people reach adulthood they generally desire to leave the family home and seek greater independence. In the past, this normal life transition often was denied to people with physical or intellectual challenges. Their main options were usually to remain in the family home, or enter an institution.



Today, LutherCare's dedicated group living staff help residents lead active, independent lives. A normal day may include school or work, recreational outings, household duties, outings and visits with friends or family.
