Luther Special Care Home

Located at 1212 Osler Street in Saskatoon, Luther Special Care Home (LSCH) provides a caring home for 127 full time residents, and also offers two rooms for short term respite care, for a total capacity of 129.

Program Features

LSCH is affiliated with the Saskatoon Health Region and accredited by the Canadian Council on Health Services Accreditation. Its services include:

- 24-hour professional nursing care
- Secure dementia care unit
- Spiritual care for residents and staff of all faiths
- Physical and occupational therapy
- Aqua therapy pool
- Dietician
- Social worker
- Therapeutic recreation
- Power beds for all residents
- Active volunteer program
- Hair salon
- Home-like environment



Community Day Programs

LSCH operates three community day programs for seniors living in the community who could benefit from increased social and recreational opportunities. Participants pay a nominal fee. Programs are offered as follows:

Young at Heart - Mondays 11 a.m. - 2 p.m., McNaughton Place, 302 6th Ave. N.

TEMT (Travel, Eat, Meet, Talk) - Tuesdays 11 a.m. - 3 p.m., LSCH, 1212 Osler St.

Live Smart - Thursdays 10 a.m. - 1 p.m., Clinkskill Manor, 115 19th St. E.



Admissions

Admission to Luther Special Care Home or Luther Seniors Centre requires assessment by the Client Patient Access Service (CPAS) of the Saskatoon Health Region.

CPAS assessment is not required for enrolment in one of LSCH's Community Day Programs.

Luther Seniors Centre

Located at 1800 Alexandra Avenue in Saskatoon, Luther Seniors Centre (LSC) offers a community day program each weekday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. for adults with irreversible dementia.

Program features

- Professional nursing supervision
- Spiritual care
- Support group for caregivers
- Bathing, as required
- Hot lunches and refreshment breaks
- Recreation and social activities
- Snoezelen Room
- Referrals to other agencies

Participants must be ambulatory or able to transfer from wheelchair with assistance. As the program is primarily designed to serve people living in the community, admission of personal care home residents may be restricted.
